

MASONIC ETIQUETTE Dr. Jay B. Kosner

Masonic Etiquette, for the most part, is merely good manners and respect for your lodge, its members, its Worshipful Master and the convention of Freemasonry, in general.

Unfortunately, Blue Lodge Etiquette is largely unpublished and unspoken, therefore, up until now it has been more difficult to learn its rules and nuances.

You may study ritual work, degree work, floor work and know all Masonry's glorious history, Masonic symbols, jewels, etc. but there is very little written about how to comport yourself so you do not look foolish or be regarded as disrespectful.

Few Masonic mentors include a list of proper Lodge behavior, as they have learned it, themselves, incident-by-incident, and usually learned by them after their having made an error and being kindly informed by another member as to the correct Masonic etiquette of the situation.

CONFORMING TO MASONIC ETIQUETTE

Over time, and by watching others, members conform themselves to exhibit proper Masonic etiquette behavior to learn lodge customs.

MASTER'S AUTHORITY:

During his term in office, the brother who has been elected as Master is the most powerful member of the Lodge. He also shoulders all of its many responsibilities.

The Worshipful Master has the authority to:

1. Rule any brother out of order on any subject at any time.

2. Decide what can and cannot be discussed.

3. Courteous brethren accept the requests made by the Master to serve on various committees such as the examination committee, the investigation committee and other duties, as determined by the Lodge's needs.

The following items are not Masonic offenses. They are simply a lack of Masonic Etiquette...or in other words, considered to be "bad form" or bad manners.




"SO MOTE IT BE" (Probably Masonry's Oldest Expression)

The oldest known of Masonic expressions is "SO MOTE IT BE" and is used in and outside of Lodge as a general response to Masonic prayer. It derives from the famous Regius poem, sometimes called Halliwell Manuscript, said by experts to be written in about 1390 by a monk who had access to Operative Masonic documents. The document was discovered by a citizen of London, a nonmason, Mr. J. O. Halliwell, in about 1839 in the British Museum where it was cataloged under the title "A Poem of Moral Duties".

The poem, written in Chaucerian English, is the oldest known Masonic document in existence. The unknown monk who composed it showed a remarkable clarity of understanding about the fraternity of Freemasons of the time, who were, of course, of Operative workmen. He lists the rules that governs the craft, and the religious duties of the Craftsmen. Nearly all of the articles set forth in this ancient document, nearly six hundred years old, are as applicable today (in substance) as they were when written.

The final words in the poem are: "Amen! and Amen! So mote it be!: "Mote" is the Anglo-Saxon word originally derived from the Saxon word "Motan" meaning "may". It is the ancient "Amen" of the Freemason. Such as: "So May it Be".
