





"SO MOTE IT BE"

(Probably Masonry's Oldest Expression)

The oldest known of Masonic expressions is "SO MOTE IT BE" and is used in and outside of Lodge as a general response to Masonic prayer. It derives from the famous Regius poem, sometimes called Halliwell Manuscript, said by experts to be written in about 1390 by a monk who had access to Operative Masonic documents. The document was discovered by a citizen of London, a nonmason, Mr. J. O. Halliwell, in about 1839 in the British Museum where it was cataloged under the title "A Poem of Moral Duties".

The poem, written in Chaucerian English, is the oldest known Masonic document in existence. The unknown monk who composed it showed a remarkable clarity of understanding about the fraternity of Freemasons of the time, who were, of course, of Operative workmen. He lists the rules that governs the craft, and the religious duties of the Craftsmen. Nearly all of the articles set forth in this ancient document, nearly six hundred years old, are as applicable today (in substance) as they were when written.

The final words in the poem are: "Amen! and Amen! So mote it be!: "Mote" is the Anglo-Saxon word originally derived from the Saxon word "Motan" meaning "may". It is the ancient "Amen" of the Freemason. Such as: "So May it Be".

THE MASONIC OBLIGATION AND THE ART OF TRICKERY

We've been tricked. Of course, being tricked isn't always bad. Sometimes there's a reason for it and in this case the reason leads to a profound Masonic lesson.

Before we are allowed to enter, the Master was assured that we were worthy and well qualified, in other words that we were honorable men.

We are led to believe that the secrets we are being sworn to protect are matter of life and death. The vast majority of Masons spend the rest of their lives believing the Craft's secrecy is the most important aspect.

Curiously, though, when you ask Masons precisely what the secrets are, they can't say...because they actually don't know.

We were tested by being required to make a promise. Then we are watched to see how we treat that promise as we progress through out our Masonic travels.

Most Masons, eventually, realize that there are no real secrets in Freemasonry, but still decline to discuss the confidences with which the Lodge has trusted him.

A less than honorable man would disregard his promise as trivial. Only a truly honorable man would stand by his word no matter what, as Joshua did in the ninth chapter of the book of Joshua in the Bible.

When a man gives his word, how well he keeps it is a measure of how honorable he is.


